




SECTION 1: Individual Targets


When **cutting** scoring paper targets or no-shoots, only the lower portion, or a diagonal portion, or one of the sides can be cut, and a replacement non-scoring border must be fitted (see Rule 4.2.3.2):






When **painting** scoring paper targets or no-shoots, only the lower portion, or a diagonal portion, or the sides can be painted. A replacement non-scoring border is not necessary, but the use of tape to create a sharply defined boundary of the Hard Cover is recommended (see Rule 4.2.3.3):






1.3 If a single target is cut vertically to represent two targets, the two pieces must be placed at least 1m apart. However, a scoring target may be painted with a vertical strip of Hard Cover, provided it is not treated as more than a single target (see Rule 4.1.5):



A portion of one scoring target or no-shoot must not be placed within the boundaries of another scoring target or no-shoot, and a scoring target or no-shoot must not be hollowed:




1.5 The top of scoring targets or no-shoots must never exceed 1.8m in height:




SECTION 2: Multiple Paper Targets

2.1 The upper portion of scoring paper targets or no-shoots must never be removed or concealed:




2.2 Whole paper targets must not be used as Hard Cover (see Rule 4.1.4.1). To segregate two adjacent scoring targets, use a no-shoot:




2.3 A no-shoot may be placed to the forward or to the rear of two adjoining scoring targets:





2.4 Overlapping paper targets can be comprised of just two scoring targets, or two scoring targets with a no-shoot separating them:





2.5 Target arrays which are illogical or impractical, or which are overly complicated, thereby making them difficult to replace consistently for the duration of a match, will not be approved:

















2.6 Any mini-targets in an array must be placed at least 2m. rearwards from the last full size scoring or N/S target in that array.








SECTION 3: Mixing Paper & Metal Targets

4.1 Target arrays such as "stars", "plate racks", "trees", and similar devices are not approved. However, up to 2 authorized plates, presented above a sturdy common base, may be approved.
